RIGHT IS RIGHT!

There are many standards of right and wrong in our world. One is whatever the majority believes and does is right. Some believe each person should determine his own standard. Another standard is that might makes right. Actually, the only standard that is right and cannot be wrong is the Word of God. The Bible gives principles of right and wrong that have served mankind for millenniums, and which cannot be improved by man's reasoning. This article addresses various situations wherein right is right and is never wrong.

Right is right even if most people disagree. Most of the Jews disagreed with Paul when he tried to teach them the gospel. (Rom.10:1-3) The majority of people today will not accept the gospel. But the pure, unadulterated gospel is still right, and it always will be right. Right is right regardless of how few agree and are willing to accept it.

Right is right even if you must stand alone. Jesus had only a few people who were dedicated followers, even though multitudes heard him speak and saw his miracles. "*From that time many of His disciples went back and walked with Him no more.*" (John 6:66) Even Peter followed him "*at a distance*" when Jesus was arrested, and then he denied even knowing Jesus. Jesus stood alone. Paul stood alone. (II Tim.4:16) There are times in life when we have to stand alone if we stand for what is right. But right is still right even then.

Right is right even if it is difficult to do. Queen Vashti refused the request of the king of Persia to show off her beauty by dancing before his guests at a feast. She knew there would be severe consequences in refusing. She lost the throne and was divorced by the king and replaced, all because she did what was right. (Esther 1) Was it difficult? Most definitely! John the Baptist suffered the loss of his life when he told Herod that it was unlawful for him to have his brother's wife. (Matt.14:3,4) He did what was right, because it was right, regardless of the circumstances. Are we willing to do the same?

As Christians, we have the responsibility of standing for what is right, whether others agree or not, whether we stand alone or not, and whether it is difficult or not. Circumstances do not determine what is right and wrong. The Word of God is the standard of truth and right, and only when we stand with it are we right. However, we cannot stand for what is right unless we know what is right. Some were rebuked for not knowing, when by reason of time, they should have been teaching others. They still were needing the milk of the word rather than the solid food of maturity. "*But solid food belongs to those who are of full age, that is, those who by reason of use, have their senses exercised to discern both good and evil.*" (Heb.5:12-14)
